

UNIV NORTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRESS SO FAR JUNE 2025





INTRODUCTION

Welcome to this third edition of the Univ North Progress Update and you join at what (to us at least) is an incredibly exciting point in the project. SDC are delighted to be able to share with you the huge strides that have been taken towards completing the construction works. In October 2024, at the time the last progress book was produced, the frame for Walnut Lawn Villa was still being erected and we had just completed the first student bedrooms. Since then, the CLT frame to Walnut Lawn Villa has been completed and we are virtually finished with the façade works and brick cladding allowing us to progress with internal works. Banbury Road Villa's frame is now complete, and we are just starting to cover the frame with insulation and brickwork.

More consequentially however, we are pleased to say that SDC has now handed over possession to the College of the Nursery, Water Court West, Water Court East and Woodstock Pavilion allowing the teams from the Domestic Bursary to begin preparing for the first students to move in at the start of Michaelmas Term.

We hope that you enjoy seeing these latest progress images from throughout the project.






PROGRESS FROM THE AIR

Recent drone footage captured over the Univ North development site showcases significant construction progress across multiple phases of the project. These aerial views offer a comprehensive look at ongoing works, highlighting the evolving landscape, structural milestones, and the logistical coordination on-site. These aerials cover the time from October 2024 up until May 2025.







Taken in Nov 24, this shot shows Water Courts West and East, with Sparkle the Tower Crane still sat in between. At this point, we were approximately half way through the bricklaying to the external façade of Walnut Lawn Villa.



Dec 2024 – Waterproof membranes had been laid onto the roof of Water Court East in preparation for the roof battens and tiles to be laid.



Woodstock Pavilion, a building with a very different design style to the other buildings on the site is now structurally complete. Works to waterproof and seal the building are now underway.






March 2025 – Roof tiling to Water Courts East & West in full swing.

Earlier on in the year we removed the scaffolding surrounding both Water Court Villas following completion of the façade and now both buildings can be seen in all their glory.










This photo taken during the removal of the scaffold now reveals the terracotta coloured roof tiles, deliberately chosen to blend in with the skyline of this part of North Oxford.

Principal donor Visit


In October 2024 we were honored to receive a visit to the Project by the principal donor for the Univ North scheme, David Frederick and his wife Sophia Lynn.






INTERNATIONAL VISIT





















Now that Water Court West has been handed over to the College, the gym space shown in this photo will begin to be equipped over the summer in preparation for student occupation.


The completion of the CLT (Cross Laminated Timber) frame marked a major milestone in the Univ North project as all the buildings on the site have taken shape.



















EXTERNAL PROGRESS

Across all areas of the site, much attention has recently been given to the external hard and soft landscaping.


Work to the Nursery play area has progressed significantly as well as the paved areas around the Water Court Villas.








Woodstock Pavilion, shown here with the scaffolding removed, has followed a different design philosophy to the other buildings within the development.
