Activities marked in YELLOW and EMBOLDENED are organised by the college and/or your subject tutors. Attendance is compulsory at these activities and should take precedence over all other commitments. For some of these events, particularly the Library Inductions, Sexual Consent Workshops, Equality, Diversity and Inclusivity Workshops, and Academic Transition Support sessions, students have been divided into small groups by subject. Please read the timetable carefully to check that you attend the correct event. An appendix is also included that provides a subject-by-subject overview of the schedule for these events.

Activities marked in **BLUE** are organised by the JCR (or another student organisation such as the Oxford SU), and you are free to take part as much or as little as you would like.

Your subject tutors may also contact you to organise subject meetings during Welcome Week.

Short 30-minute webinars have been scheduled into your timetable to introduce you to the University's Bodleian Libraries and how they can help you on your course. These will take place via Microsoft Teams. There is no need to register; just click the link in your timetable to join the webinar at your preferred time.
